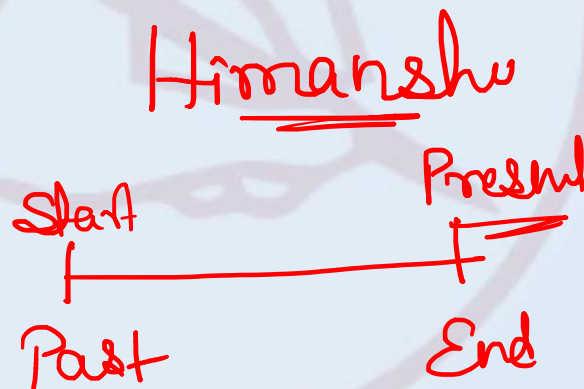

① If + S + V₁ ————— S + shall/will + V₁

② If + S + V₂ ————— S + would + V₁

③ If + S + had + V₃ ————— S + would + have + V₃

① Type 1 = In Case of any fact ✓ — (always use Simple Present)

If + Sub + V₁ S + V₁ / V_s

Ex - If I throw this from here, It goes straight down

② Type 2 - Any Sentence related to imagination.

If + S + were S + would / could + V₁

Ex - If I were a bird, I would fly high in the sky.

③ Type 3 - In Case of Inversion (No Cony)

Had + Sub + V₃ S + would + have + V₃

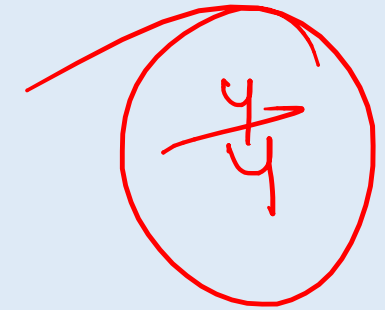
