Headstrong

Meaning: जिद्दी, Determined to have one's own way; stubbornly and often recklessly willful

Key: head strong

Description: medical science के मुताबिक जिन लोगो के head mentally strong होते हैं वे लोग स्वभाव से बड़े जिद्दी होते हैं.

Synonyms: ungovernable, obstinate, stubborn, violent, heady



Heyday

Meaning: the stage or period of greatest vigor, strength, success, सुख समृद्धि

Key: day hi(हाय)

Description: दिन भर में कई सारे लोग मुझे hi करें, मेरे लिए यही सुख समृद्धि है.

Synonyms: prime, height, wildness



Lukewarm

Meaning: गुनगुना, Only moderately warm

Key: लू (लू)के -warm

Description: लू के दिनों में गर्मी (warm) के कारण हर जगह हर चीज moderate warm सी रहती है.

Synonyms: cool, tepid, languid, indifferent



Hedonist

Meaning: आनंदजीवी, Pursuit of or devotion to pleasure, especially to the pleasures of the senses

Key: head honest

Description: हमारी company का head बहुत honest है, इस वजह से हम आनंदजीवी जीवन व्यतीत करते हैं.

Synonyms: sensualist



Guffaw

Meaning: जोर जोर से हँसना, A loud and boisterous laugh

Key: गुफा

Description: काली पहाड़ी की गुफाओं में से किसी के जोर जोर से हंसने की आवाज आती है.

Synonyms: laugh, belly laugh



Invective

Meaning: Insulting, abusive, बेज्जती करना

Key: active नहीं

Description: जो लोग active नहीं होते हैं उन लोगो की office में बड़ी बेज्जती होती है.

Synonyms: railing, sarcasm, satirical, abusive, vitriolic



Hearsay

Meaning: अफवाह, Information received from other people that cannot be adequately substantiated;
rumor

Key: hear -say

Description: लोगों को पहले हर बात ध्यान से सुननी चाहिए फिर कहनी चाहिए यँ ही अफवाह नहीं उडानी चाहिए.

Synonyms: fame, common talk, gossip, report, rumor




Untenable



Definition Incapable of being defended or justified

Usage The lawyer told his client that if he did not tell him the entire truth any defence that he adopted would fail and make his position more untenable.





Zealous



The environmental activists are very zealous with their advocacy

Definition showing great energy and enthusiasm for something, especially because you feel strongly about it

Usage The young boy was zealous about his first day of school



Adroit



Eg. Being adroit at multi-tasking

Definition skillful and smart, especially in dealing with people

Usage He is an exceptionally adroit pianist



Atrocity



Definition a cruel and violent act, especially in a war

Usage The evil witch performed one atrocity after another.



Catastrophe



Definition a sudden event that causes many people to suffer | an event that causes one person or a group of people personal suffering, or that makes difficulties

Usage The plane slowly landed to avoid a catastrophe
