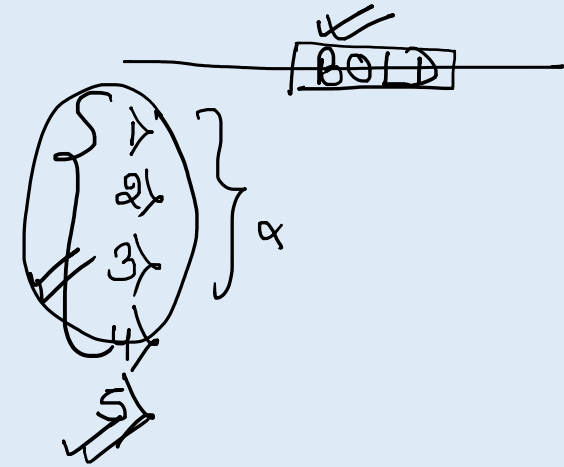

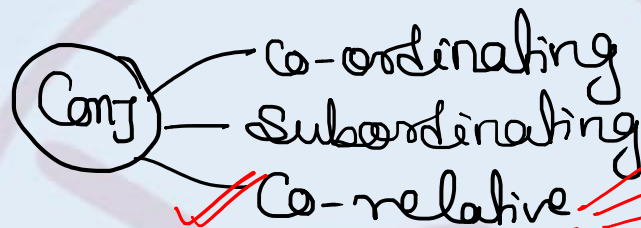

### Rule 3:

- ❖ These are uncountable nouns. ✓
- ❖ We can not pluralise such nouns by adding 's' or 'es'.
- ❖ We should not use article A/An with such nouns. These are -

Scenery, poetry, furniture, advice, information, hair, language, business, mischief, bread, stationery, crockery, luggage, baggage, postage, knowledge, wastage, money, jewellery, breakage, word (while indicating any promise/message) etc.

If the same noun is repeated after preposition, the noun will be singular.

### Rule 5:

If a numeral adjective is used with a noun, the noun will be in singular.

### **RULE 6:**

1) A **Compound Noun** ( number-noun) is not used in plural if the noun does the work of an adjective  
example-

**note-** can also be remembered as "**hyphened noun**"

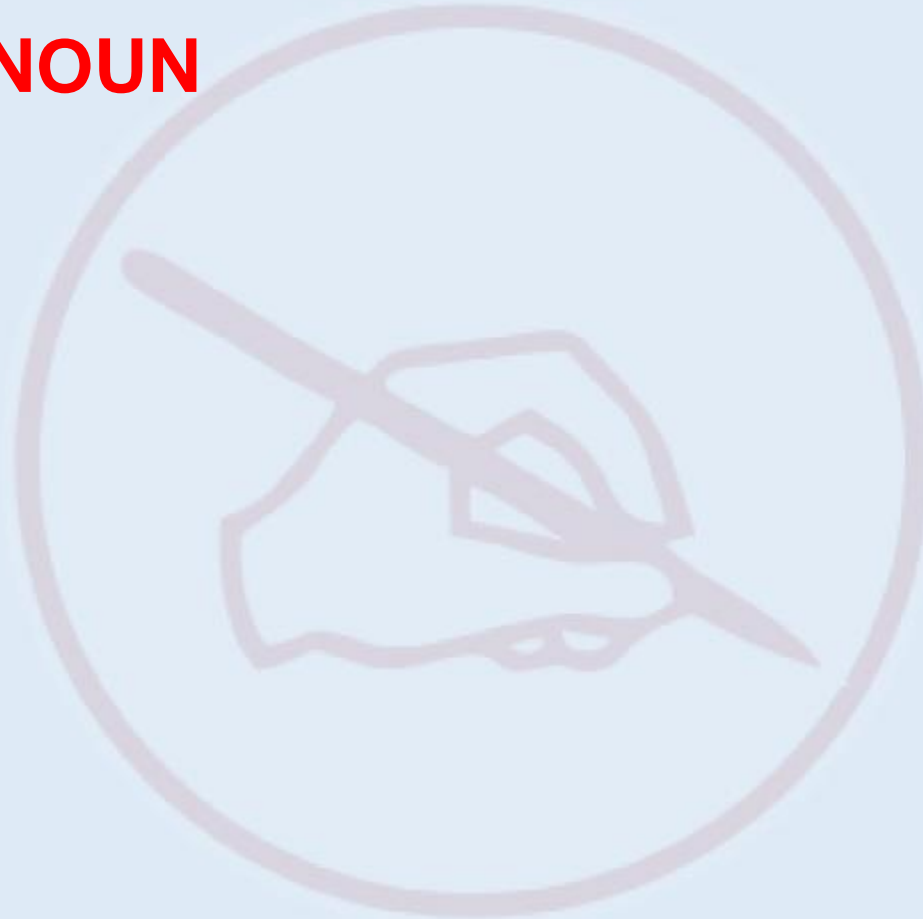
