GRAMMAR RULES



ADVERBS RULES

Rule 1 : The adverb (As) is not used after call and consider.

He called me as a fool X

He called me a fool. ✓

I always consider him as my brother. X

I always consider him my brother. ✓

ADVERBS RULES

Rule 2 The derived adjectives such as interested / satisfied / delighted are used with ‘much’ but not ‘very’.

I am very interested to play cricket. X

I am much interested to play cricket. ✓

ADVERBS RULES

Rule 3 : The adverb 'very' is used with positive adjectives and 'much' with comparative adjective forms.

He is very clever to understand it. ✓

He is much clever to understand it. X

ADVERBS RULES

Rule 4 : ‘Very much’ should be used with comparative forms.

It is very much better to stay here tonight. ✓
