The Staff Selection Commission is making recruitment to the posts of Multi Tasking Staff in Pay Band-1(₹ 5200-20200/-) + Grade Pay ₹ 1800/-,(Revised Pay Scale after 7th CPC Pay Matrix Level – 01) a General Central Service Group 'C' Non-Gazetted, Non-Ministerial post in various Central Government Ministries / Departments / Offices, in different States / Union Territories. The Commission proposes to hold a Common Examination for all applicants for posts in different States / UTs on 16.04.2017, 30.04.2017 and 07.05.2017 and if required on subsequent dates. Candidates shortlisted on the basis of their performance in the examination will be required to appear for a descriptive type qualifying paper for testing basic language skills. The date of descriptive paper will be intimated in due course.

2. Vacancies / Reservation : Vacancy position indicated by the Regional Offices of the Commission in different States / UTs is tentative. Firm number of vacancies for the post of Multi Tasking Staff, will be determined by them in due course. (Annexure-XI)

Note-I :Reservation for SC/ST/OBC/PH/ExS etc. categories is available as per extant Govt. Orders.

Note-II : The Commission reserves the right to fill up analogous posts in other Ministries/Organizations under the Government from this recruitment.

3. Eligibility/Permissible disability for PH candidates:

One Leg affected (OL), One Arm affected (OA), One Arm One Leg affected (OAL), Both Leg Affected but not Arm (BL), Blind(B), Low Vision (LV), Hearing (H), Communication (C) are eligible of the post of Multi Tasking Staff.

4. NATIONALITY / CITIZENSHIP:

A candidate must be either:

- (a) a citizen of India, or
- (b) a subject of Nepal, or
- (c) a subject of Bhutan, or
- (d) a Tibetan refugee who came over to India, before the 1st January,1962, with the intention of permanently settling in India, or
- (e) a person of Indian origin who has migrated from Pakistan, Burma, Sri Lanka, East African countries of Kenya, Uganda, the United Republic of Tanzania(Formerly Tanganyika and Zanzibar),Zambia, Malawi, Zaire, Ethiopia and Vietnam with the intention of permanently settling in India.

Provided that a candidate belonging to categories (b), (c), (d) and (e) above shall be a person in whose favour a certificate of eligibility has been issued by the Government of India.

A candidate in whose case a certificate of eligibility is necessary may be admitted to the Examination but the offer of appointment will be given only after the necessary eligibility certificate has been issued to him by the Government of India.

5(A) AGE LIMIT: 18-25 years as on 01.08.2017 (i.e. he/she must have been born not earlier than 02.08.1992 and not later than 01.08.1999)

Note I: Candidate should note that Date of Birth as recorded in the Matriculation / Secondary Examination Certificate or an equivalent certificate available on the date of submission of application will only be accepted by the Commission for determining the Age- eligibility and no subsequent request for its change will be considered or granted .

5.(B) Permissible relaxation of Upper age limit prescribed under para 4(A) above:

NOTE-I : Ex-servicemen who have already secured employment in civil side under Central Government in **Group 'C' posts on regular basis after availing of the benefits of reservation given to ex-servicemen for their re-employment are NOT eligible for fee concession. However, he/she can avail of the benefit of reservation as ex-serviceman for subsequent employment if he/she immediately, after joining civil employment, gives self-declaration/undertaking to the concerned employer about the date-wise details of application for various vacancies for which he/she had applied for before joining the initial civil employment as mentioned in the OM NO. 36034/1/2014-Estt (Res) dated 14.08.2014 issued by DOP&T.**

NOTE-II : The period of "Call up Service" of an Ex-Serviceman in the Armed Forces shall also be treated as service rendered in the Armed Forces for purpose of age relaxation.

NOTE-III : For any serviceman of the three Armed Forces of the Union to be treated as Ex-Serviceman for the purpose of securing the benefits of reservation, he must have already acquired, at the relevant time of submitting his application for the Post / Service, the status of ex-serviceman and /or is in a position to establish his acquired entitlement by documentary evidence from the competent authority that he would complete specified term of engagement with the Armed Forces within the stipulated period of one year from the Closing Date .

EXPLANATION :An 'ex-serviceman' means a person –

- i) who 'has served in any rank whether as a combatant or noncombatant in the Regular Army, Navy and Air Force of the India Union, and
 - (a) who either has been retired or relieved or discharged from such service whether at his own request or being relieved by the employer after earning his or her pension; or
 - (b) who has been relieved from such service on medical grounds attributable to military service or circumstances beyond his control and awarded medical or other disability pension; or
 - (c) who has been released from such service as a result of reduction in establishment; or
- ii) who has been released from such service after completing the specific period of engagement, otherwise than at his own request, or by way of dismissal, or discharge on account of misconduct or inefficiency and has been given a gratuity; and includes personnel of the Territorial Army, namely, pension holders for continuous embodied service or broken spells of qualifying service; or
- iii) personnel of the Army Postal Service who are part of Regular Army and retired from the Army Postal Service without reversion to their parent service with pension, or are released from the Army Postal service on medical grounds attributable to or aggravated by military service or circumstance beyond their control and awarded medical or other disability pension; or
- (iv) Personnel, who were on deputation in Army Postal Service for more than six months prior to the 14th April, 1987;or
- (v) Gallantry award winners of the Armed forces including personnel of Territorial Army; or
- (vi) Ex-recruits boarded out or relieved on medical ground and granted medical disability pension.

EXPLANATION-II : The persons serving in the Armed Forces of the Union, who on retirement from service, would come under the category of “ex-serviceman” are permitted to apply for re-employment one year before the completion of the specified terms of engagement or within one year after the closing date whichever is earlier, and avail themselves of all concessions available to ex-servicemen but shall not be permitted to leave the uniform until they complete the specified term of engagement in the Armed Forces of the Union.

NOTE- IV: AGE CONCESSION IS NOT ADMISSIBLE TO SONS, DAUGHTERS AND DEPENDENTS OF EX-SERVICEMEN.

NOTE-V: Service Clerks in the last year of their colour service in the Armed Forces, i.e. those who are due for release from the Army during the period **30.01.2017 - 29.01.2018** are only eligible for age-relaxation. Such candidates are not entitled to any concession in fee. Such candidates will be eligible to compete only for vacancies in Armed Forces Headquarters and Inter-Service Organization, which are not reserved for Ex-servicemen, in their order of merit and subject to availability of vacancies.

NOTE VI: As per Supreme Court direction dated 24.02.1995 in Appeal No.731-69 of 1994, Age relaxation will be available for the Group-‘C’ posts in the O/o RGI (Registrar General of India) for retrenched Census employees as under :

- (i) **Age relaxation by 3 years plus length of service rendered by them in connection with census, before retrenchment ,**
- (ii) **Weight age of past service.**

5(C) : PROCESS OF CERTIFICATION AND FORMAT OF CERTIFICATES:

Candidates who wish to be considered against vacancies reserved or seek age-relaxation **must submit requisite certificate** from the competent authority issued on or before the prescribed date, in the prescribed format whenever such certificates are sought by the Regional/Sub-Regional Office. Otherwise, their claim for SC/ST/OBC/PH/EXs status will not be entertained and their candidature/applications will be considered under **General (UR)** category. The formats of the certificates are annexed. Certificates obtained in any other format will not be accepted. Certificate for the status of Creamy Layer issued between **30.01.2014 to 29.07.2017** only will be accepted. Candidates are warned that they will be permanently debarred from the examinations conducted by the Commission in case they fraudulently claim SC/ST/OBC/EXs/PH status.

NOTE I : Candidates are warned that they may be permanently debarred from the examination conducted by the Commission in case they fraudulently claim SC/ST/OBC/EXS/PH status.

5(D) Visually handicapped (VH) candidates with visual disabilities **of forty percent and above and candidates suffering from Cerebral Palsy** can avail the assistance of a **SCRIBE** in the Written Examination subject to such requests being made in the application form. Question Papers and Answer Sheets will not be provided in **BRILLE**.

No attendant will be allowed with VH/Cerebral Palsy candidates inside the examination premises.

NOTE: Persons with visual disability of **less than forty percent** will not be considered as visually handicapped persons. **One eyed candidates** and partially blind candidates who are able to read the normal Question Paper set for all the candidates with or without magnifying glass and who wish to write/indicate the answer with the help of Magnifying Glass will be allowed to use the Magnifying Glass in the Examination Hall and **will not be entitled to a Scribe**. Such candidates will have to bring their own Magnifying Glass to the Examination Hall. Similarly, other persons with less than forty percent (40%) disability will not be considered as OH/HH category as the case applicable

6. EDUCATIONAL QUALIFICATION : (As on 01.08.2017)

Must have passed Matriculation Examination OR equivalent from a recognized Board.

Note: Candidates who have not acquired but will acquire the educational qualification and acquire documentary evidence from the Board/University in support thereof as on 01.08.2017 will also be eligible.

7. **MODE OF PAYMENT:** Application Fee & Mode of Payment: Rs. 100 (One hundred only)

Candidate may note that only online applications will be accepted at: <http://ssconline.nic.in>.

All Women candidates and candidates belonging to Scheduled Caste, Scheduled Tribe, Physically Handicapped, and Ex-Servicemen eligible for reservation are exempted from paying application fee, as per extant government orders.

7(i): The candidates who are not exempted from paying examination fee may submit the requisite fee through State Bank of India only either in the form of challan, generated on line, or through SBI Net Banking. Payment can also be made through any Credit or Debit Card.

7(ii) Fee once paid will not be refunded under any circumstance.

NOTE I: No change of Centre of Examination will be allowed under any circumstances. Hence, the candidates should select the centres **carefully** and indicate the same **correctly** in their applications.

9. SCHEME OF EXAMINATION:

(A) SCHEME OF THE WRITTEN EXAMINATION AND SYLLABUS

The written examination will consist of (Paper-I) **objective type** paper and (Paper-II) **descriptive type** as shown below :

NOTE-I : Paper-I will consist of **Objective Type- Multiple choice questions** only. The questions will be set **both in English & Hindi**. The Commission reserves the right to set the questions additionally in regional languages subject to technical feasibility.

NOTE-II: **There will be negative marking of 0.25 marks for each wrong answer.** Candidates are, therefore, advised to keep this in mind while answering the questions.

NOTE-III: Paper-II will be descriptive in which the candidate will be required to write short essay/letter in English or **any language** included in the 8th schedule of the Constitution.

NOTE-IV: Paper-II will only be of qualifying nature and is intended to test elementary language skills in view of recategorization of the post as Group-C and in view of job requirements.

NOTE-V: Paper-II will be held only for such candidates who meet the cut-off prescribed by the Commission in Paper-I for different categories. The date and time of the Paper will be communicated to shortlisted candidates in due course. Commission reserves the right to set separate qualifying standard in any Part of Paper-I.

Indicative Syllabus for written examination:

Paper-I Questions on 'General Intelligence and Reasoning' will be non-verbal considering the functions attached to the post. Questions on Numerical Aptitude and General English will be simple, of a level that an average matriculate will be in a position to answer comfortably. Questions on General Awareness will be also of similar standard.

General Intelligence: It would include questions of non-verbal type. The test will include questions on similarities and differences, space visualization, problem solving, analysis, judgment, decision making, visual memory, discriminating observation, relationship concepts, figure classification, arithmetical number series, non-verbal series etc. The test will also include questions designed to test the candidate's abilities to deal with abstract ideas and symbols and their relationship, arithmetical computation and other analytical functions.

English Language : Candidates' understanding of the Basics of English Language, its vocabulary, grammar, sentence structure, synonyms, antonyms and its correct usage, etc. his/her writing ability would be tested.

Numerical Aptitude: This paper will include questions on problems relating to Number Systems, Computation of Whole Numbers, Decimals and Fractions and relationship between Numbers, Fundamental arithmetical operations, Percentages, Ratio and Proportion, Averages, Interest, Profit and Loss, Discount, use of Tables and Graphs, Mensuration, Time and Distance, Ratio and Time, Time and Work, etc.

General Awareness: Questions will be designed to test the ability of the candidate's general awareness of the environment around him and its application to society. Questions will also be designed to test knowledge of current events and of such matters of everyday observation and experience in their scientific aspects as may be expected of an educated person. The test will also include questions relating to India and its neighbouring countries especially pertaining to Sports, History, Culture, Geography, Economic scene, General Polity including Indian Constitution, and Scientific Research etc. These questions will be such that they do not require a special study of any discipline.

NOTE: For VH candidates of 40% and above visual disability and opting for **SCRIBE** there will be no component of **Maps/Graphs/Diagrams/Statistical Data in the General Intelligence & Reasoning / General Awareness Paper.**

Paper-II: The Paper will be set in English and Hindi and to the extent possible in other languages mentioned in the 8th Schedule of the Constitution as given in Annexure-X, to

test basic language skills commensurate with the educational qualification prescribed for the post. Candidates will be required to write one short essay/letter in English or any language included in the 8th schedule of Constitution.

10. GENERAL INSTRUCTIONS TO BE COMPLIED BY THE CANDIDATES IN THE WRITTEN EXAMINATION

- (i) Candidates must write the papers/indicate the answers in their own hand.
- (ii) In the question papers, wherever necessary, the Metric systems of weights and measures only will be used.
- (iii) Candidates are not permitted to use calculators and other electronic gadgets except as specified in the Notice. They should not, therefore, bring the same inside the Examination Premises / Venue.
- (iv) If any candidate is found to possess mobile phones or any other means of wireless communication in the working or switched off mode, his/her candidature shall be cancelled forthwith.

11. MODE OF SELECTION :

Candidates will be shortlisted for the Paper-II on the basis of their performance in Paper-I. Paper-II will only of qualifying nature. The cut-offs in Paper-I and qualifying marks in Paper-II may be different for vacancies in each State/UT will be fixed at the discretion of the Commission. Candidates for each State/UT will be finally selected based on their performance in Paper-I, subject to their meeting basic qualifying standards fixed in Paper-II.

Provided that SC, ST, OBC and PH candidates, who are selected on their own merit without relaxed standards, will not be adjusted against the reserved share of vacancies. **Such SC, ST, OBC and PH candidates will be accommodated against the general/unreserved vacancies as per their position in the overall Merit List.** The reserved vacancies will be filled up separately from amongst the eligible SCs, STs, OBCs, and PH candidates which will, thus, comprise of SC, ST, OBC and PH candidates who are lower in merit than the last general candidate in merit list of unreserved category but otherwise found suitable for appointment even by relaxed standard.

Physically Handicapped (OH/VH) category candidate who qualifies on the basis of relaxed standards viz. age limit, experience or qualifications, permitted number of chances in written examination, extended zone of consideration, etc. is to be counted against reserved vacancies and not against general vacancies subject to fitness of such candidate for selection. Such candidates may also be recommended at relaxed standards to the extent of the number of vacancies reserved for them, to make up for the deficiency in the reserved quota, irrespective of their rank in the order of merit. In

so far as cases of Ex-Serviceman are concerned, deduction of the military service rendered from the age of Ex-Servicemen is permissible against the reserved or unreserved posts and such exemption cannot be termed as relaxed standards in regard to age.

Success in the examination confers no right of appointment unless government is satisfied after such enquiry as may be considered necessary that the candidate is suitable in all respects of appointment to the service/post.

12. RESOLUTION OF TIE CASES

In cases where more than one candidate secure the equal aggregate marks, tie will be resolved by applying the following methods one after another :-
