1. The number of rural workers who is has often not been able to absorb everything, are entering the urban labour market with a rapid pace.
2. Despite of some issues, migration has resulted of the well being of households, especial for people with higher skills, social connections, belonging of lower castes and tribes who have also brought in enough income to improving the economy condition of his households in rural areas.
3. Data has shown that a migrant's earning account for a higher proportion of household income between the lower castes and tribes which have helped to improve the standards of the family members leeve behind.
4. The need for a national policy towards internal migration have been understood by the fact that less than 20% of urban migrants has arranged jobs and nearly two-thirds manages to find jobs within a week of their entry of the city.
5. The Supreme Court on Wednesday has given the government 10 day to provide petitioners, including former Union Ministers Yashwant Sinha and Arun Shourie, informations which can be legitimate placed in the public domain for the Rafale deal.
6. More from 31 years after 38 Muslims from Hashimpura rounded up and shoot dead by the Uttar Pradesh Provincial Armed Constabulary (PAC), the Delhi High Court on Wednesday has sent 16 former jawans for life imprisonment, holding them guilty for murder.
7. Madras High Court on Wednesday ban online sell of medicines that could be sold only in pharmacies for the prescription of a register medicine practitioner.
8. A cashier of a nationalised banking branch at Chithamur arrested with charges of not making properly entries in the account records with the amount he collected during the demonetisation drive last year.
9. Due to India's standing as one of the major banana-producing country in the world, Tamil Nadu has been not able to export their produce with air due to the fruit's weight (making it uneconomical) and their short shelf life.
10. A day when Union Finance Minister Arun Jaitley blames the Reserve Bank of India (RBI) for the bad loans crisis, the Madras High Court on Wednesday questioned the Centre why it did not take steps to recover such loans by exercise the powers to be given to them under the Companies Act of 2013.
