DEMONSTRATIVE PRONOUNS

Pronouns that point to specific things:

- ✓ **THIS**
- ✓ **THAT**
- ✓ **THESE**
- ✓ **THOSE**

DEMONSTRATIVE PRONOUNS

- ❑ These words refer to people/things or events that have already been mentioned.
- ❑ **How about the blue car? Is that an alternative.**
- ❑ **THOSE when we are referring to something for the second time using the same noun.**
- ❑ **The professor suggested me some books, but I am unable to find those.**

**EVERYBODY, SOMEBODY, NOBODY, SOMEONE,
NO ONE, EVERYTHING, SOMETHING, NOTHING,
ALL, SOME, ANY, MOST, ENOUGH, BOTH ,
MANY, FEW, LITTLE, ONE, ETC.**

With indefinite pronouns we use the masculine gender:

- ☐ **Anyone can be confident if he tries.**
- ☐ **Each of them has come to meet the P.M.**
- ☐ **Everyone has to perform at the function.**

ONE: used to refer to people in general.

We use the possessive determiners **ONE'S** and the reflexive pronoun **ONESELF** for **ONE**.

- ✓ **One wants only the best for one's business.**
- ✓ **There are things one can do to make oneself and one's children happier.**

INDEFINITE PRONOUNS

- ✓ **One always prefers to complete his project himself. (wrong)**
- ✓ **One always prefers to complete one's project oneself. (right)**



When more than two persons or things are spoken

we use ANYONE (not either)

- He is more passionate than either of his four brothers. (Wrong)
- He is more passionate than anyone of his four brothers. (Right)

- 1. Though she appears to be very tall/ she is just an inch/ taller than me./ NE**
- 2. It was with great difficulty / that each of the brothers/ could get their share of property./ NE**
