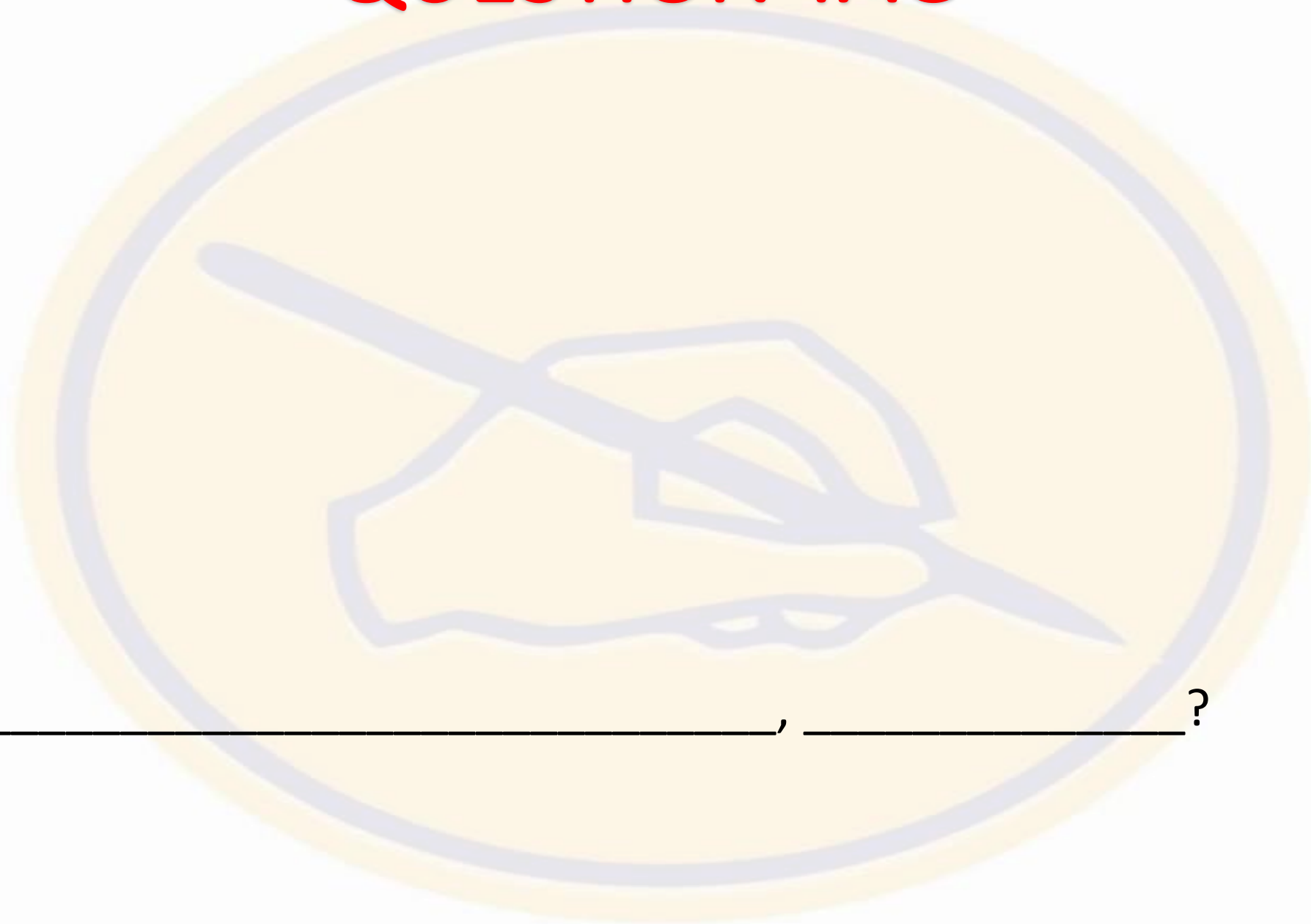

# QUESTION TAG

• **SENTENCE-** A set of words that is complete in itself providing a meaning.

• **TYPES OF SENTENCES:**

**1. ASSERTIVE**

**2. INTERROGATIVE**

**3. IMPERATIVE**

**4. EXCLAMATORY**

**5. OPTATIVE**

• **E.g-**

**You have done this work, \_\_\_\_\_?**

**He is not a good boy, \_\_\_\_\_?**

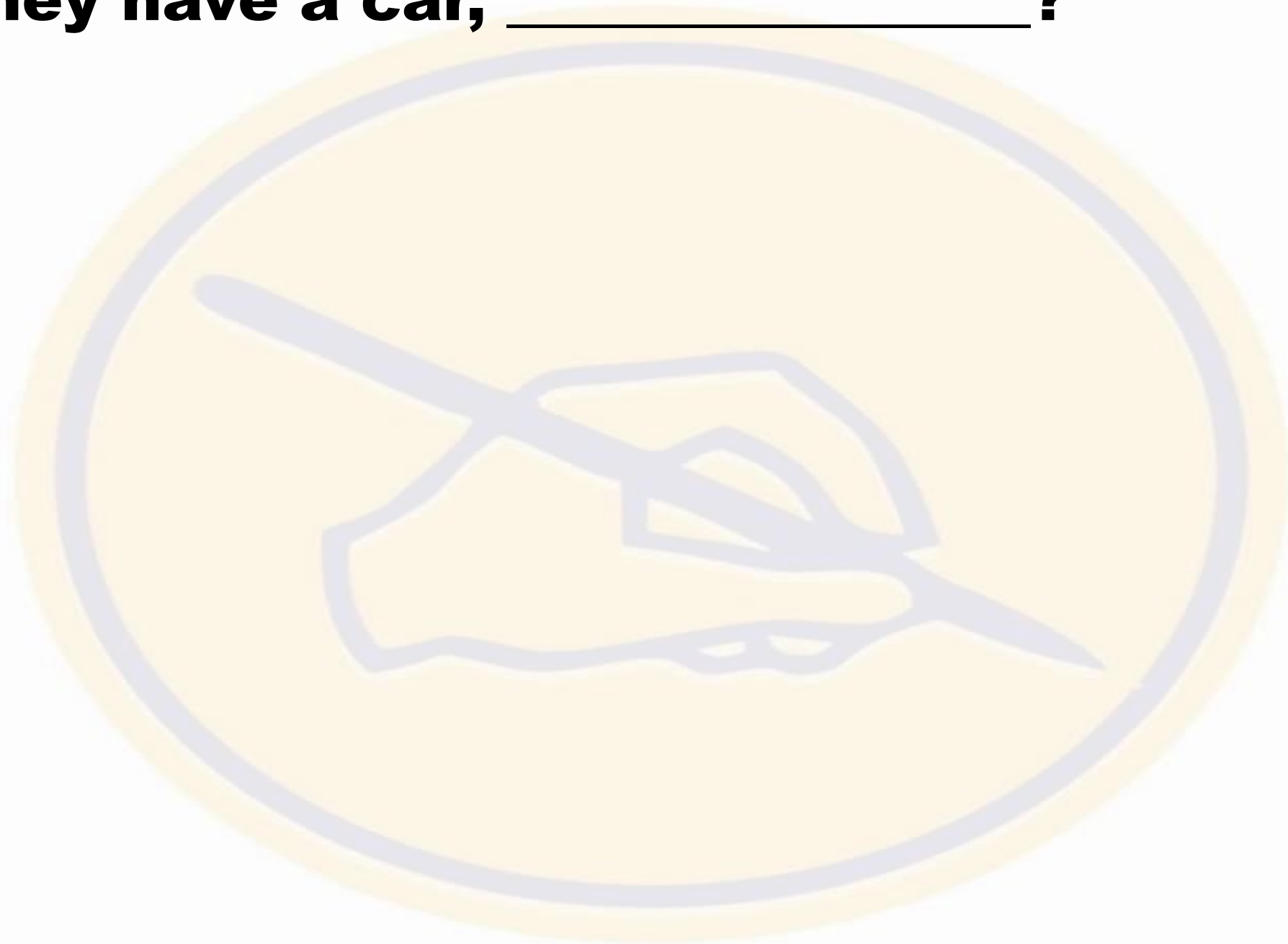
**Rohan has done this work, \_\_\_\_\_?**

## • **RULES:**

- 1. If sentence is affirmative, question tag will be negative.**
- 2. If sentence is negative, question tag will be positive.**
- 3. The subject of the sentence will always be written in its pronoun form, when used in forming question tag.**
- 4. When we add 'not' in question tag, it should always be in contracted structure with the verb of the respective question tag.**



- **E.g-** They have a car, \_\_\_\_\_?



- **RULE 1:** When the sentence doesn't have an auxillary verb, we use **“to-do verb”** as auxillary verb in the question tag.

- **Some more examples:**

1. Tom has completed his work,

2. He had no money to buy a car,

3. Rose smells sweet,



**E.g- Everyone has gone, \_\_\_\_\_?**

**Rule 2 :** According to the rule of subject verb agreement, the number of a verb always depends upon its respective noun.

**Each, every, everyone, everybody, no one, nobody, none** are singular and hence will take singular verb/ singular pronoun/ singular adjective with them but their question tag will take plural verb and plural pronoun.

**. E.g: Everyone has come, hasn't he? ( Incorrect)**

**. Everyone has come, haven't they? (correct)**
