India's Forex reserves inches-up by over \$67 mn

India's forex reserves comprise of foreign currency assets (FCAs), gold reserves, special drawing rights (SDRs) and the RBI's position with the International Monetary Fund (IMF).

Number of women in higher education up 45% in 8 years

The number of women enrolling for higher education in India has gone up by 45 per cent to 17.4 million in 2017-18 from 12 million in 2010-11.

CSKA Moscow win Russian Super Cup

Indian Women's Compound Archery Team Reaches World Rank 1

Indian women's compound archery team created history by becoming the world rank one side in the category. The team is six points ahead of the Chinese Taipei team. With the contribution from each member, the women's compound archery team jumped to the top spot with 342.6 points, with the Chinese Taipei team standing second with a difference of six points.

Indian GDP may moderate to 7.2% in second half of 2018: Nomura Report

Nomura expects GDP growth to peak in April-June quarter and then moderate to 7.2 per cent in the second half of 2018 from around 7.8 per cent in first half.

China launches high-resolution Earth observation Gaofen-11 satellite

China has launched an optical remote sensing satellite Gaofen-11, as part of its high-resolution Earth observation project. It was the 282nd flight mission by a Long March carrier rocket.

Former West Bengal governor Gopalkrishna Gandhi has been selected for this year's Rajiv Gandhi Sadbhavana Award for promoting communal harmony and peace.

Azad, Najma Heptulla conferred Outstanding Parliamentarian award

Leader of Opposition in the Rajya Sabha Ghulam Nabi Azad, Manipur Governor Najma Heptulla and BJD MP Bhartruhari Mahtab were conferred the Outstanding

First India-Indonesia Interfaith Dialogue to be held in October

The first India-Indonesia Interfaith Dialogue, decided during the maiden visit of Prime Minister Narendra Modi, will be held in early October, the Indian Embassy said. Minister of State for External Affairs M J Akbar, who visited Indonesia, discussed with the Indonesian Foreign Minister Retno Marsudi, concrete steps to follow up on Prime Minister Modi's visit in May, the embassy said.

Third bi-monthly monetary policy review

The Reserve Bank of India has hiked repo rate by 25 basis points to 6.50 per cent in its third bi-monthly monetary policy review. With this, Reverse repo rate has become 6.25 percent and bank rate is 6.75 percent. At the same time, the Reserve Bank has estimated GDP growth rate to be 7.5- 7.6 percent during the April-September period of the current financial year, and the overall growth projection for the entire fiscal year is maintained at 7.4 percent.

In its review, the Reserve Bank further said that retail inflation is estimated to be at 4.8 percent in the second half of the current financial year. For the July-September quarter, it has projected inflation to be at 4.6 percent.

✎ The Reserve Bank of India constituted a Damodaran Committee in 2011, to look into banking services

rendered to retail and small customers, including pensioners and also to look into the system of grievance redressal mechanism prevalent in banks, its structure and efficacy, and to suggest measures for expeditious resolution of complaints.

✎ The statutory power for exchange control was provided by the Foreign Exchange Regulation Act (FERA) of 1947, which was subsequently replaced by a more comprehensive Foreign Exchange Regulation Act, 1973.

✎ The term LBW means Leg before wicket.

✎ United Nations' (UN) World Day of Social Justice is annually observed on February 20 to encourage people to look at how social justice affects poverty eradication. It also focuses on the goal of achieving full employment and support for social integration.

✎ Wembley Stadium is a football stadium in Wembley, London, England, which opened in 2007, on the site of the original Wembley Stadium.
