# **PRONOUN**

# MEANING

**‘Pronouns’** are used in place of a noun that has already been mentioned or that is already known, often to avoid repetition of the **‘noun’**.

**For example:**

Kate was tired so she went to bed.

Michael took the children with him.

Kieran’s face was close to mine.

I have a pen that was stolen last week.

## **SOLVE:**

- **He, you and I will be rewarded.**
- **He, you and I will be punished.**
- **We, you and they will be punished.**
- **We, you and they should do **our/your/their** duty sincerely.**



# **RULE:**

**When more than one Persons are used in a sentence, the order should be:**

- **When all Personal Pronouns are singular + sentence is positive :**
- **When all Personal Pronouns are singular + sentence is negative :**

**231**

**123**

**When all Personal Pronouns are plural + sentence positive/negative :**

**123**

**If the sentence includes possessive case :**

**123**

# **RULE:**

The 'to be' form of verb (is, am, are, was, were) is always followed by subjective form of the pronoun.

2. Let it go.
3. I shall meet none except her tomorrow.
4. Good students like him should take part in cultural activities also.

## **RULE:**

**Words such as 'Let, like, all prepositions, except and but' should always be followed by objective form of pronoun.**

- **Indians should never fight with each other.**
- **None of his arms was wounded in the accident.**
- **Both you as well as Rohan is going there.**
- **Both of them are not going there.**

- 1. Use of 'Each Other', 'Either', 'Neither':** These are used in the sentence when there is need to show two people / objects.
- 2. Use of 'One Another', 'None', 'Anyone':** These are used in the sentence when there is need to show more than two people / objects.
