

### 1. IRREFRANGIBLE

**(ADJECTIVE):** definite

Synonyms: indisputable, undeniable

Antonyms: dubious, refutable

Example Sentence:

Planck's theory is irrefragible.

### 2. VESTIGE (NOUN):

hint

Synonyms: clue, trace

Antonyms: ignorance, callowness

Example Sentence:

A remnants of half lit cigarette butts

were the vestige of fresh fugitive.

### 3. SECEDE (VERB):

pull away

Synonyms: split from, retract

Antonyms: remain, maintain

Example Sentence:

The kingdom of Belgium seceded

from the Netherland.

### 4. DISCOURSE (NOUN):

dialogue

Synonyms: conversation, discussion

Antonyms: silence, reticence

Example Sentence:

They better understand the language of political discourse.

### 5. INTONATED

**(ADJECTIVE):** spoken

Synonyms: choral, verbal

Antonyms: modest, introverted

Example Sentence:

Her intonated please was filled with sheer remorse.

### 6. PROSECUTION (NOUN):

pursuit

Synonyms: execution, undertaking

Antonyms: disregard, oversight

Example Sentence:

The news channel's prosecution of its commercial ends.

### 7. COMPORT (VERB):

conform

Synonyms: fit, agree

Antonyms: disagree, conflict

Example Sentence:

Adil and Aditya do all that nature and art

can do to comport with his will.

### 8. EBONIZE (VERB):

darken

Synonyms: blot, smudge

Antonyms: lighten, whiten

Example Sentence:

He ebonized the exact location in the

map.

### 9. CONVENE (VERB):

muster

Synonyms: assemble, gather

Antonyms: disperse, scatter

Example Sentence:

The commander-in-chief had convened a

secret meeting of military personnel.

### 10. OBVIATE (VERB):

prevent

Synonyms: eliminate, preclude

Antonyms: support, assist

Example Sentence:

The settlement obviated the need for the

separate cases to be heard in court.
