

- 1. IMPARTIALLY (ADVERB):** justly  
Synonyms: honestly, reasonably  
Antonyms: unfairly, unjustly  
Example Sentence:  
She has impartially proofread the speed test.
- 2. PROGNOSTICATE (NOUN):** forecast  
Synonyms: adumbrate, presage  
Antonyms: ignore, doubt  
Example Sentence:  
The abbot has already prognosticated his death.
- 3. SLANT (NOUN):** point of view  
Synonyms: standpoint, view  
Antonyms: perusal, scrutiny  
Example Sentence:  
My slant about his personality is very positive.
- 4. FEND (VERB):** defend  
Synonyms: guard, protect  
Antonyms: lay bare, endanger  
Example Sentence:  
Do not try to fend him.
- 5. TAPER OFF (VERB):** abate  
Synonyms: die out, diminish  
Antonyms: increase, go up  
Example Sentence:  
The reactions soon tapered off.
- 6. FOIST (VERB):** force upon  
Synonyms: impose, enforce  
Antonyms: overlook, neglect  
Example Sentence:  
She foisted the unnecessary norms over him.
- 7. MEEK (ADJECTIVE):** shy  
Synonyms: compliant, docile  
Antonyms: immodest, intractable  
Example Sentence:  
She is a meek girl and has always been like that.
- 8. PREEMINENT (ADJECTIVE):** distinguished  
Synonyms: peerless, renowned

**Antonyms:** unimportant, insignificant  
**Example Sentence:**  
He is a preeminent scientist.

**9. ARBITRARINESS (NOUN):** bigotry  
Synonyms: extremism, contumacy  
Antonyms: calmness, peacefulness  
Example Sentence:  
Education freed us from the orders and arbitrariness of individuals.

**10. DEBILITATE (VERB):** incapacitate  
Synonyms: attenuate, eviscerate  
Antonyms: strengthen, invigorate  
Example Sentence:  
Taking hot drinks, habitually, tends to debilitate our organs.
