**Ans.** Use 'for' instead of 'since'

**2.** When he did not find his cook in the kitchen he asked his wife where had he gone.

**Ans.** Use 'where he had gone'

**3.** Although I am playing cricket for more than three years, I have not been able to score a century.

**Ans.** Use 'have been' instead of 'am'

**4.** By the time we got our tickets and entered the cinema theatre, the show was already begun.

**Ans.** Use 'had' instead of 'was'

**5.** I have passed the examination three years ago.

**Ans.** Remove 'have'

**6.** He has read four plays written by Shakespeare by the end of his vacation.

**Ans.** Use 'will have' instead of 'has'

**7.** Since the trip home was expensive, I did not went home during the holidays.

**Ans.** Use 'go' instead of 'went'

**8.** Before the teacher could finish the question, the students gave the correct answer.

**Ans.** Use 'had given' instead of 'gave'

**9.** It is time we should have done something useful.

**Ans.** Use 'did' instead of 'should have done'

**10.** Each one of them has have his share of joy and sorrow.

**Ans.** Use 'had' instead of 'have'

**11.** The teacher asked the students whether they could tell the name of the man who had been discovered America.

**Ans.** Use 'had' instead of 'had been'

**12.** Had the police not reached here on time,  
the traders would have robbed.

**Ans.** Use 'would have been' instead of  
'would have'

**13.** The Government warned the multiplexes that if they continue charging prices higher than MRP, their licences would be cancelled.

**Ans.** Use 'continued' instead of 'continue'

**14.** Ram was telling that everyone was happy with the bonus.

**Ans.** Use 'saying' instead of 'telling'  
(Tell, command, forbid, advise, etc. + Object)

**15.** My teacher wanted to know if I had done the homework or not.

**Ans.** Use 'whether' instead of 'if'

**16.** He will certainly help you if you will ask him in a pleasant manner.

**Ans.** Use 'if you ask him'

**17.** Seldom I have seen such a beautiful sight.

**Ans.** Use 'have I' instead of 'I have'

**Law of Inversion-**

**Seldom, never, hardly, rarely, scarcely.**

**18. Only by taking a risk, he saved her life.**

**Ans.** Use 'did he save' instead of 'he saved'

**Law of Inversion- (Only + adverbial phrase)**

**Only yesterday, only day before yesterday, only last month,  
only after a year, only in a few countries, only in this way,  
only then, etc.**

**19.** At no time, the C.M. was aware of what was happening.

**Ans.** Use 'was the C.M.' instead of 'the C.M. was'

**Law of Inversion-**


**At no time, Under no circumstances, In no way, On no account, On no condition, etc.**

**20.** So well she sang that everyone started clapping.

**Ans.** Use 'did she sing' instead of 'she sang'

**Law of Inversion-**

**So + Adverb of Manner + HV + Sub + MV**
