1351. Untether (v)  
**Meaning:-** untie (बंधे हुए को खोल देना)  
**Key:-** लेदर  
**Trick:-** ये लेदर का बैग को Untether कर दो, मुझे कुछ रखना है |  
**Example:-** I reached the horses and untethered them.
1352. Unethical (adj)  
**Meaning:-** Not morally correct (अनैतिक)  
**Key:-** ethical  
**Trick:-** जो ethical नहीं वो Unethical.  
**Example:-** It is unethical to torment any creature for entertainment.
1353. Unprecedented (adj)  
**Meaning:-** Never done or known before (अभूतपूर्व)  
**Key:-** president  
**Trick:-** इस president के बारे में मैं Unprecedented था |  
**Example:-** The government took the unprecedented step of releasing confidential correspondence.
1354. Unconcern (n)  
**Meaning:-** a lack of worry or interest (उदासीनता)  
**Key:-** concern (चिंता)  
**Trick:-** जिसे नहीं किसी चीज का concern, वो होता Unconcern.  
**Example:-** He is famed for his 'laid-back' attitude, his apparent unconcern about his actions.
1355. Vital (adj)  
**Meaning:-** Essential, crucial (महत्वपूर्ण)  
**Key:-** REVITAL  
**Trick:-** REVITAL की गोली ENERGY के लिए Vital है |  
**Example:-** Secrecy is of vital importance.
1356. Vicissitudes (n)  
**Meaning:-** change (चढ़ाव-उतार)  
**Key:-** ATTITUDE  
**Trick:-** ऐसे ATTITUDE में आयेंगे बहुत से Vicissitudes.  
**Example:-** Her husband's sharp vicissitudes of fortune.
1357. Voyeuristic (adj)  
**Meaning:-** relating to enjoyment from seeing the pain or distress of others (दृश्यरतिक)  
**Key:-** वो rusticate  
**Trick:-** वो rusticate हुआ जिसे देखकर इसे मिला Voyeuristic.  
**Example:-** The voyeuristic pleasure of spying on relationships under pressure.
1358. Vaudeville (n)  
**Meaning:-** entertainment (कामिक नाटक)  
**Key:-** वो DEVIL  
**Trick:-** वो है तो DEVIL किन्तु करता है बहुत Vaudeville.  
**Example:-** His comedic roots are in vaudeville.
1359. Vivid (adj)  
**Meaning:-** producing powerful feelings, clear images (सुस्पष्ट)  
**Key:-** विविध भारती  
**Trick:-** विविध भारती का चित्र अब Vivid हो चुका है |  
**Example:-** Memories of that evening were still vivid.
1360. Vindictive (adj)  
**Meaning:-** hateful, revengeful (प्रतिशोधी)
- Key:-** detective (गुमचर)  
**Trick:-** detective अपने दुश्मनों को छोड़ते नहीं, Vindictive लेते हैं |  
**Example:-** The criticism was both vindictive and personalized.
1361. Whopping (adj)  
**Meaning:-** very large (भारी)  
**Key:-** वो पिन  
**Trick:-** वो पिन बहुत ही Whopping है, तुमसे नहीं उठेगा |  
**Example:-** A whopping Rs. 74 million loss.
1362. Waiver (n)  
**Meaning:-** giving up; letting go (त्याग, छूट)  
**Key:-** वेव मॉल  
**Trick:-** वेव मॉल में मुझे बहुत से Waiver मिले |  
**Example:-** Their acquiescence could amount to a waiver.
1363. Woolly (adj)  
**Meaning:-** confused (अस्तव्यस्त)  
**Key:-** wool  
**Trick:-** wool का स्वेटर पहना हुआ लड़का बहुत ही Woolly हो गया |  
**Example:-** Woolly thinking.
1364. Accoutrements (n)  
**Meaning:-** an additional item of dress or equipment (अतिरिक्त सामान)  
**Key:-** account में  
**Trick:-** account में मेरे इतने सारे Accoutrements कैसे आ गये |  
**Usage:-** The accoutrements of religious ritual.
1365. Accretion (n)  
**Meaning:-** gradual growth, addition (अनुवृद्धि, संचयन)  
**Key:-** ये क्रिशन  
**Trick:-** ये क्रिशन अच्छा काम कर रहा, Accretion हो रहा है इसका |  
**Usage:-** Coca Cola estimated about 40 cents of lost earnings per share accretion due to the devaluation of their stock.
1366. Accrue (v)  
**Meaning:-** increase by addition or growth, often financial (प्राप्ति होना, वृद्धि होना)  
**Key:-** केबिन क्रू  
**Trick:-** केबिन क्रू ने अच्छा काम किया जिससे उसका Accrue हो रहा |  
**Usage:-** Rohan thinks that he is not responsible for any traumas which accrue.
1367. Acerbity (n)  
**Meaning:-** bitterness of taste (कटुता, कठोरता)  
**Key:-** असर बेटी  
**Trick:-** असर बेटी पर भी आ रहा उसके दोस्तों की Acerbity का |  
**Usage:-** The acerbity in the teacher's tone made the children cry.
1368. Acolyte (n)  
**Meaning:-** attendant, usually in a church (सहायक, अनुचर)  
**Key:-** इसको लाइट  
**Trick:-** इसको लाइट में लाओ, हर कोई इसका Acolyte बनेगा |  
**Usage:-** The acolyte's positive statement left no room for doubt.
1369. Acquisitive (adj)  
**Meaning:-** eager to obtain knowledge or things (अर्जनशील, संग्रहणशील)  
**Key:-** इसको city  
**Trick:-** इसको city से सीखने में मजा आता है, ये Acquisitive है |  
**Usage:-** We live in a competitive and acquisitive society.
1370. Acrimony (n)

**Meaning:-** bitterness or ill feeling (तेजी, कटुता)

Key- अकड़ी money

Trick- अकड़ी money तुम्हारे पास आयेगी तो तुममे Acrimony भी आ जाएगा |

Usage- This book review was written with acrimony.

1371. Actuate (v)

**Meaning:-** start a function or action, motivate (चालू करना, उकसाना)

Key- एक ट्यूटर

Trick- एक ट्यूटर मुझे चाहिए जो मेरे बेटे को Actuate कर सके |

Usage- To actuate the marathon, the race supervisor will fire the starting gun.

1372. Adamant (adj)

**Meaning:-** refusing to be persuaded or to change one's mind (कठोर, हठी)

Key- एडम

Trick- एडम बहुत ही Adamant इंसान है |

Usage- He is adamant that he is not going to resign.

1373. Adduce (v)

**Meaning:-** cite as evidence (प्रमाण देना, पेश करना)

Key- ad use

Trick- तुम्हारा ad use उसने किया, इसका मैं Adduce देता हूँ |

Usage- A number of factors are adduced to explain the situation.

1374. Adjudicate (v)

**Meaning:-** make a formal judgement on a disputed matter (निर्णय देना)

Key- अब जो दिक्कत

Trick- अब जो दिक्कत आयेगी मुझे बताना, मैं उसका Adjudicate दे दूंगा |

Usage- The board will adjudicate claims made against teachers.

1375. Adjure (v)

**Meaning:-** urge or request (अनुरोध करना)

Key- आप जोर

Trick- आप जोर लगाकर उससे Adjure कीजिये तब वो मानेगा |

Usage- I adjure you to tell me the truth.
